

Register to vote

Londoners, first of all, make sure you register to vote. It takes a few minutes, if you head to www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

You must be aged 16 or over; a London resident; and a British or Irish citizen, a qualifying Commonwealth or EU citizen, or an EU citizen with retained rights.

Accepted forms of photo ID

Secondly, make sure you have and can present one of these accepted forms of photo ID to vote in person, at the polling station:

- UK, Channel Islands or EEA driving licence
- UK, Commonwealth or EEA passport
- National identity card issued by an EEA state
- Biometric immigration document
- Blue Badge scheme card
- 60+ Oyster photocard or a Freedom Pass
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Ministry of Defence Form 90

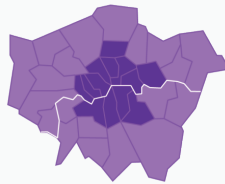
There are three types of elections in London:



Mayor of London and London Assembly elections



General/parliamentary elections



Local/borough elections

British, Irish and qualifying Commonwealth citizens are eligible to vote in Mayor of London/London Assembly elections, General/parliamentary elections, and Local/borough elections.

Qualifying EU citizens or EU citizens with retained rights over the age of 18 are only eligible to vote in Mayor of London/London Assembly and Local/borough elections.
