

How to vote

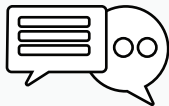
There are three different ways to vote:



In person: You will be sent a poll card to your address, which will tell you where your local polling station is. You will need to bring one original accepted form of photo ID to vote at the polling station.



By post: If you aren't able to vote in person, you can apply for a postal vote. You will not need to provide photo ID to vote by post. There are other identification checks, including verification of your signature and date of birth.



By proxy: If you cannot vote in person, e.g. for health reasons, you can nominate someone to vote on your behalf. You will need to complete a form and send it to your local Electoral Registration Office to do so. Your proxy will have to bring their own photo ID to vote on your behalf.

The Elections Act (2022) has changed the way we vote. If you are a Londoner, you now need to show an accepted form of photo ID to vote in person.
